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ANALYTICAL SUMMARY

PALACIOS FERNÁNDEZ, Emilio Juan Meléndez Valdés, A Reformer Dedicated to Enlightenment

ABSTRACT: The study constitutes an overview of varied contributions by Meléndez Valdés to Enlightenment culture, not only literary texts but also works concerning legal issues and care of the poor. *Las bodas de Camacho, el rico*, the author's only dramatic work, is viewed in terms of his friendship with Jovellanos. The pastoral drama obeying neoclassical norms provoked opposition as well as admiration. Meléndez's letters reveal the significance of friendship for him, while the fragment of the *Cartas turcas* illustrates his desire to experiment. A comparison of prologues to editions of poetry (1785 and 1820) brings out increasing self-confidence, while entry into the Real Academia Española (1810) evidenced his official recognition. More substantial coverage is given to the analysis of legal texts which demonstrate Meléndez's humanism while not transgressing contemporary legal practice, while his efforts to reform institutions for the poor in Ávila illustrate clerical obscurantism and self-interest clashing with humanitarian principles.

ASTORGANO ABAJO, Antonio Concerning the Augustinian Friar Antonio José de Alba (1735-1813), Teacher of Méléndez Valdés

ABSTRACT: From 1772 Meléndez Valdes had links with the convent-school of St. Augustine in Salamanca, a community of Agustinian monks, where he had friends enthusiastic about poetry such as Diego González (Prior), Juan Fernández de Rojas, Andrés del Corral, Pedro Madariaga and Antonio José de Alba. During the period 1775-1780 they met regularly in the cell of the Prior Diego González. There grew a firm friendship, based

on the same poetic and ideological tastes which had affinities with Jansenism. The present study attempts to outline the essential biographical characteristics of Antonio José de Alba and his relationship with Meléndez.

LORENZO ÁLVAREZ, Elena de The Cosmic Sublime in the Poetry of Juan Meléndez Valdés

ABSTRACT: Meléndez himself indicated in 1797 that contemplation of the immensity, variety and order of the universe and its place in the great chain of being was one of the main subjects of his own philosophical poetry and a means of renewing Spanish poetry in general. The present study identifies this subject matter with the aesthetics of the cosmic sublime which characterizes a major strand of contemporary European philosophical poetry. In particular, the article highlights specific texts –in addition to ones from the European poets traditionally cited– which may have contributed to Meléndez's concept of the cosmic sublime, and draws attention to the presence of this thematic strand throughout Meléndez's poetic career (1780-1814), analyzing the chosen poems from the perspective of the literary, philosophical and religious context of the cosmic sublime.

The Vindication of Eros in the Age of Enlightenment: *Los besos de amor* by Juan Meléndez Valdés

ABSTRACT: The article attempts to demonstrate how, in eighteenth-century Europe, certain literary texts with an erotic subject matter belong to the change in thinking and practices associated with the Enlightenment. The argument begins with an examination of how ideas relating to human sexuality contribute to a new vision of humanity grounded in Enlightenment thought. Links are made between theorizing elsewhere in Europe and the expression of concepts of sexuality at variance with official thinking in Spain but which can be observed in cases preserved in Inquisition files. Having established this intellectual and cultural framework, the collection of poems entitled *Los besos de amor* by Juan Meléndez Valdés is analysed in an attempt to demonstrate how the author's exploration of human sexuality defies the restrictions placed on such writings by the Spanish Inquisition, with the result that Meléndez's verses could not be published in his lifetime.

ABSTRACT: A few months before the publication of the first posthumous edition of the *Poesías* of Juan Meléndez Valdés, two other exiles, who like him were unable to return to Spain, brought to light an unpublished version of the poem of the great author. The new version needs to be added to those already in existence; however, the curious fact about the new version is that it was expurgated due to the conditions of exile exarcerbated by the absolutism of King Fernando VII.

The Apotheosis of Hercule by François Lemoyne in Versalles: Its purpose and context. A possible interpretation based on the French traditional politics

ABSTRACT: In opposition to some trends of historiography that describe the painting of this period as pleasant and ornamental, we try to show how this work presents rather the image of the power that Louis XV and his principal ministry Fleury had. They try, through this work, to reinforce the principles of French monarchy. In this politically convulsed environment, where jansenist, the parliaments and some parts of the nobility were questioning the traditional basis of sovereignty, Lemoyne proposed, through allegory and centered in the figure of Hercules –a frequent iconography element in the European courts–, and also, with the close collaboration of the duke d'Antin and Fleury, the Apotheosis of the French monarchy. The objective is to establish the intentionality of this work through this historical context and compare the changes between the first project of 1730 and the final project.

The *Diccionario feijoniano (1802)*, by Antonio Marqués y Espejo, a step forward in the circulation of Feijoo's work

ABSTRACT: Feijoo's work was widely circulated during a large part of the 18th century. However, it suffered an obvious and progressive decline after his death in 1764. Therefore, several years later Marqués y Espejo decided to try to revitalize in some way the important work of the Benedictine writer. In order to do so, he worked to transform it, mainly through an important work of summarising, with a view to eradicate all those elements which were more complex discursively and less understandable for average people. Making it into a dictionary was also an important factor in his modernization plan. Topics were arranged in alphabetical order, consequently making it easier for the masses to acquire knowledge.

Historiography, Education and Enlightenment. An Overview of Education in Eighteenth-Century Spain

ABSTRACT: The historical account of Spanish education during the Enlightment have given rise to a picture linking political and social circumstances. In the past few years, new approaches have intensified research on the subject, both inside and outside the Iberian Peninsula. This development in the historiographical account of Education in such an interesting period calls for a thorough discussion on the current situation.

ABSTRACT: During the Bourbon reforms modernization and secularization were among the bases of a general plan for remedying a situation of decay which had been detected since the previous century. In that framework, concepts such as education had significance in the debates generated by the Spanish Enlightenment and the development of reforms. In this piece of work we analyse the evolution in the concept of education during the eighteenth century, its relationship with the regeneration ideal and its connection with the rise of the political economy debates. The work pursues the delimitation of the semantic field in which that concept is included in connection with others, opposite or parallel, also the reforms entailed by the process of secularization and educational modernization in addition to the different forms of sociability and circulation of ideas that allowed discussion in Spain.

Educating the audience and the king: a case of licenses in the *Teatro dei Fiorentini* in Naples

ABSTRACT: In the city of Naples there were several important theaters during the XVIIIth century, and some of them were specialized in prose or opera, such as the *Teatro dei Fiorentini* and *Teatro di San Carlo* respectively. Even when aware of the royal prohibition on representing each genre in the coliseum that was not allowed, some promoters asked the monarch for a license, as did Giuseppe Coletta, of the *Fiorentini*, who wanted to represent *Federico II*, by Comella, in prose, in the *San Carlo*.
