CONDITIONS FOR SENDING ORIGINAL MANUSCRIPTS TO STVDIA HISTORICA. HISTORIA ANTIGUA

- 1. *STUDIA HISTORICA. HISTORIA ANTIGUA* is a journal published annually, manuscripts submitted for possible publicatin will be assessed by two external reviewers through the double blind system. The Editorial Board, respecting the intellectual freedom of the authors, will not modify the opinions they express, neither will it declare support for them.
- 2. The Editorial Board of *STUDIA HISTORICA. HISTORIA ANTIGUA* will consider unpublished manuscripts (which have not been published previously in any version and are not being submitted simultaneously for publication elsewhere), provided that they have a high level of quality and deal with aspects relating to the chronological period within the sphere of Ancient History. This may be done in several ways: by introducing new topics, using a different, more in-depth approach to a problem already recognized in historiography, contributing heretofore unknown information in relation to a specific historiographical matter, or the potential applications of a new or more refined methodology.
- 3. The original in Word Format (.doc) should be deposited in http://revistas.usal.es/index.php/0213-2052/about/submissions#onlineSubmissions. It should also be sent by e-mail to shha@usal.es. The deadline for submission of originals is 1 June of the corresponding year.
- 4. Articles should be no longer than 70,000 characters (white spaces included), including tables, diagrams, en maps captions, notes and bibliography. Each text should be preceded by a page with the title of the study, name of author or authors, professional category, work centre, full postal address, and telephone number.
- 5. All manuscripts must be accompanied by an abstract (1,000 characters maximum) in the language of the manuscript, in Spanish, and in English. The title and key words must also be sent in these same languages for indexation purposes.
- 6. Footnotes should be numbered correlatively in arabic numbers in superscript. All notes must be footnotes. An excessive number of textual quotations should be avoided, and, in any case, if the quotation exceeds two lines it should be indented. Moreover, author's comments in textual quotations should be placed between square brackets to distinguish them clearly from the text quoted.
- 7. The bibliographical references in the notes should follow the Harvard style of referencing: Author, or authors (last name in versal letter), year, xx-xx, without p. oor. pp.; n. for foot note, n° for number, col. for column. A list of bibliography must be included at the end of the article.
- 8. Books in Bibliography: Last name -in versal letter-, Name -developed name, not just initials- (year): Book tittle -in italics-, edition place. In the case of articles in journals, collective works, proceedings from conferences: author or authors (year): title in angular inverted commas << ...>>, TITLE OF THE JOURNAL OR COLLECTIVE WORK in italics, followed by the volume, edition place, when book, and page numbers. Fort he periodical titles will be the abreviations used in the Année Philologi-que, if not avalaible, write the full name.
- 9. Arabic numerals should be used in numbering divisions and sub-divisions of the manuscript, without mixing them with roman numbers or letters. The divisions of the first level should be numbered correlatively, beginning with 1. Each division of the first level can in turn be subdivided into successive levels numbered consecutively, beginning with 1. A stop should always be placed between the numbers relating to the divisions of the different levels.
- 10. The tables, graphs and maps included in the paper should be correlatively numbered with arabic numerals. Each table, graph or map should have a short title to identify it and its sources should be indicated.
- 11. The secretary's office of *STUDIA HISTORICA. HISTORIA ANTIGUA* will acknowledge receipt of manuscripts within a period of thirty working days after their reception, and the Editorial Board will decide on their publication in a maximum period of four months.
- 12. The authors will receive only one print proof. The Editorial Board requests that during the correction of proofs no major changes be made to the original text, since this may have repercussions on publishing costs. The authors commit themselves to correcting the proofs within a period of 15 days, counting from the day they are handed over to them.
- 13. STUDIA HISTORICA. HISTORIA ANTIGUA does not give the right to any payment. The publishing rights correspond to the journal and the permission of the Editorial Board is necessary for its partial or total reproduction. In any case it is necessary to indicate its provenance.
